



## **River Glen Swim and Tennis Rules - Summer 2020**

During the Summer of 2020, in response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the River Glen HOA board has put in place new rules for the use of the pool.

These rules are guided by the following CDC recommendations:

### **Waivers**

Every resident who is a member will be required to sign a waiver and release of liability in order to attend the pool. This will also be required here on out for use of restrooms and tennis courts. Once the waiver is received, your key card will be activated. This waiver is used to protect River Glen and indemnifies your guests.

### **Social Distancing In Communal Spaces**

- Designated areas will be set up on the pool deck and families are required to keep pool chairs and belongings within the designated area of the station.
- Do Not move the furniture. Do Not allow children to play on furniture.
- Club house is off limits to all except lifeguards. Use of refrigerator and microwave not permitted.
- Grill use is permitted, but BYO utensils.

## Pool Hours

- The pool will be open daily from 8am-4pm and 5pm-10pm.
- The pool will be closed daily from 4pm-5pm for extended cleaning  
**\*\*You Must Leave the Pool During This Time\*\***
- There will be a lifeguard from 12pm-8pm

## Guest Policy

- Maximum number of family members and guests your pool visit is 8
  - This does not mean you can bring your child and 6 of his/her friends.
- Resident must be present entire time guest is at the pool
- Absolutely no parties

## Cleaning Protocols

- The pool chairs and tables will be sanitized each day by the lifeguard between 4-5pm, during which time the pool is closed - no residents may be present during the cleaning time
- The lifeguards will wipe down gates, pool rails, bathroom knobs and handles during each adult swim period (:45 of every hour)
- Residents are encouraged to bring their own supplies of sanitizer and wipes, especially if you would like to clean the deck chair before your use

## Lifeguards

- Lifeguards are present 12pm-8pm
- Every day from 4pm-5pm, the lifeguard will sanitize the pool furniture
  - Please respect this rule; take all your belongings and leave the pool deck
- Lifeguards are NOT responsible for maintaining *your* social distancing nor enforcing capacity.
- Adult Swim for 15 minutes at the end of each hour provides time for the lifeguard to check chemicals, wipe down high touch surfaces and have a break
- Kids must stay completely out of the pool during Adult Swim
- This year, we are lucky to have many RG teens as lifeguards. Please show them, and all lifeguards, courtesy and respect.

## Other Safety Rules

- Children 10 and under must be accompanied by an adult (age 18+) at all times
- Members and guests under 18 years of age are not allowed to use the pool during “Swim at your Own Risk” hours without adult supervision.
- No swimming allowed when thunder and lightning can be seen or heard; wait 30 minutes before re-entering pool

- There will not be a Lost & Found container this summer. Lifeguards will be instructed to dispose of any items left in the pool area.

## **COVID-19 WARNING**

- The danger of exposure to the coronavirus that causes COVID-19 exists
- By entering the pool, you take responsibility for your own protection and for disinfecting your hands and anything you touch in the pool area
- Do not use the pool if you have a cough, fever or other symptoms of illness.
- Maintain at least 6 feet between you and other people who are not a part of your household

*Should there be consistent failure to cooperate with the rules and protocols from residents, guests, and lifeguards, the RG HOA board has the right to close the pool for any amount of time. They also have the right to change the rules and/or instill a sign up for pool use.*

## **TENNIS**

- Tennis player- residents will need to sign a waiver for use
- HOA may ask that your guests sign a waiver as well
- Tennis courts will remain use at your own risk as far as sanitizing

## **Individual Responsibility**

It will be everyone's individual responsibility to socially distance, be smart, respect your neighbors, and to follow the stated rules. The HOA board and/or the lifeguard (when present) WILL NOT be the neighborhood police for this situation. It is up to everyone to work together to make this work and for us to all be able to enjoy YOUR wonderful pool.
